Businesses located away from the FibreSpeed network still have the potential to connect to the network. That was the message to come from IT communications experts during a FibreSpeed presentation to businesses and public sector officials in Bangor.

Network officials are working closely with business networks, local authorities and Welsh Assembly Government business support advisors to assess demand. If demand is sufficient in areas away from the network, connections to it become more feasible, according to the IT companies whose job it is to help connect businesses and manage their services over the network.

At the FibreSpeed presentation in The Management Centre concerns were raised from some businesses about their ability to connect to the £30m network. Yet demand has already led to the original network being expanded. FibreSpeed service provider Keycom has connected student accommodation in Bangor to the network at Parc Menai using licensed microwave wireless technology, routed via equipment at Ysbyty Gwynedd. And Cibyn Industrial Estate in Caernarfon, where several businesses want to connect, will be a new addition later in the year.

FibreSpeed sales manager Richard Forde-Johnston said: "We're working with many different agencies to bring all enquiries from business together and see where the demand is."

"What we're saying is, whether you're near a connection point on the network or not, get in touch and talk to our service providers."
